Member Spotlight: Kristi Ross-Clausen

Kristi Ross-Clausen, Production Stage Manager at University of Wisconsin-Madison, safety consultant, and author of The Stagehand's Toolkit.

USITT: What was your first live theatre experience?

Kristi: I grew up in rural northern Wisconsin, so it was school and 4H. My high school didn't allow girls on the crew other than costumes/make-up and painting the set, so I performed. I didn't see my first professional show until I was in high school - a van and trailer version of La Boheme done in a school gym by six performers with piano accompaniment.

Ironically, I became a fan of professional theatre by watching the

movie versions of West Side Story, South Pacific, Oklahoma, and Sound of Music on TV.



You went to college for music. How did that lead you to theatre tech?

I worked my way through Lawrence University as a recording engineer for the Conservatory's classical and jazz concerts. One summer, I worked at a camp as the A1 for its performing arts center which included the high school theatre performances. The guy running the spot light for the school shows taught me how to do that. When I returned to school that fall, I started working studentdesigned shows which led to overhire opportunities and an apprenticeship with IA local 470. Years later, the lighting guy from the summer camp was the department head on my first Broadway tour!

Please share your production background. How did you learn so many disciplines?

Read everything plus asked polite questions from smart people. My parents taught me cooking, sewing, electronics, hand drafting, carpentry, etc. which gave me a great foundation. Pappy Alderson (Mick Alderson's dad), told me the more

things I could do, the more opportunities I'd have to work IA gigs, so I do it all! I love the fact there is always something new to learn, and the biggest names in the business graciously share their knowledge. If I don't know the answer, I can look it up or call someone who probably does. Now I'm on the receiving end of those calls, too.

What led you to be a stage manager? What do you like about calling shows?

Becoming a stage manager was a natural progression into leadership. I've been blessed to be mentored by some excellent people including David Stewart and Tom Bartlett.

I like the satisfaction of calling a perfect show and enjoy the challenge of handling the unexpected.

You have worked on huge concerts for famous bands like the Eagles and Steely Dan, and on Broadway touring shows. Which do you prefer? Broadway.

How did you get involved with USITT? Why do you support it?

USITT is the room where it happens for theatre tech. It's part business, part education, part extended family reunion, and all fun. Nothing else provides all those aspects in one place.

How did you end up teaching? Please describe your job at UW-Madison.

I taught K-12 choral/general music for years, just added IATSE Trained Trainer to my resume. After a one-year gig at the University of Wisconsin - Madison as production stage manager, I'm going back to K-12 teaching as technical theatre teacher at Nicolet High School in Glendale, WI.

What would you tell a student who asks what it takes to be a stage manager?


The same thing Pappy told me: the more you know, the more jobs you can take. People see the tangible of your show bible and hear you call it, but the real work is in supporting everyone involved in the production. Even if you're "only" a stage manager or "only" a lighting designer, knowing how the rest of the crew works makes you more valuable to everyone. The stage manager has to be like a duck -- cool and calm gliding along the surface while paddling madly underneath. Your ultimate boss is the audience member in the back row who just spent her last dollar to buy a ticket. If she's not happy, she won't come back and the company will eventually cease to exist. This is show business, and every business must pay the bills.

What is your favorite show you ever worked on?

Shows are like children – can't pick a favorite.

What's your bucket list show to call?

Paul Sanchez wrote a musical based on the book *Nine Lives* about New Orleans and Hurricane Katrina. The music is an amalgamation of every style you hear in New Orleans, and the story is an inspiring one of how real people persevere through overwhelming situations. My bucket list show is to call that on Broadway.

Experienced and Novice Riggers Benefit from Glerum Masterclasses

The Jay Glerum Rigging Masterclasses launched this summer with 60 attendees gathering in Denver for the two-day intensive.

Created to honor the memory of Jay O. Glerum, USITT Fellow and the author of Stage Rigging, the Glerum Workshops included two tracks: one for advanced riggers, the other for entry level people.



The advanced rigging class was coordinated by Eric Rouse, along with Gareth Conner, Pete Svitavsky, Joe Champelli, and Paul Kelm. The 30 participants from 12 states explored the challenges of integrating rigging and automation. It was certified for ETCP renewal credits. Hosted at the Seawell Grand Ballroom at the Denver Center for the Performing Arts, the event allowed attendees to dig into the complex relationship of rigging and automation, braking dynamics, and the math and physics of it all.

At the same time, across the street at at Metropolitan State University, another 30 participants were led by Ed Leahy, Shane Kelly, and Patrick Finn through the rudiments of rigging for those with no rigging experience but needing to work with rigging. The target audience was high school educators, but attendees from all walks of entertainment careers joined in.

Safety issues were an important part of the classes with experienced riggers learning about brakes and the less experience learning about safety harnesses.

Sponsors ETC, H&H Specialties, JR Clancy, Texas Scenic, and the Green Machine Employees helped keep the cost to attendees affordable. The



USITT Fellows Fund and the Glerum family, through the Glerum Family Travel

Stipend, helped some high school educators get to Denver.

The 2017 Jay O. Glerum Masterclasses are being planned with details announced shortly.



News From Mark Shanda, USITT President Really Behind The Scenes

Mark Shanda USITT President

We like to hide what we do. In fact, we invest in elaborate systems of curtains and track, or skillfully placed architectural features to prevent the audience from seeing the lighting equipment in use, the motion control mechanics, the quick change booth, as well as hiding the crew that is working hard to assist in bringing the



show to life in performance. Yet, there are times that all of our efforts to prevent folks from knowing what we are doing can backfire.

Our secret keeping can, at times, undermine our quest for appropriate levels of financial support to enable us to realize the best possible production. Theatres everywhere seem to struggle financially. Many approach production with just enough resources to "get by" and we designers and technicians often rise to the occasion by investing longer hours and through some amazing ingenuity actually pull off more than what seemed possible.

While I am a big fan of creativity, I am not very tolerant of working excessively long hours. To overcome our tendency to hide out, I would encourage all producers to occasionally draw back the curtains and let others in on both the challenges and the rewards of backstage work. The next time you integrate automation into a production, plan an open house demonstration for either target audiences like the physics faculty from your campus, or just a post show talk back that demonstrates the "how" of the special effects that you were able to integrate into your production.

Consider a pre-show audience conversation to give those who have made the effort to come to your production some insight into the research, design, and fabrication processes that have brought your project to life. In a production that has a quick change in the first act, seize a moment during intermission to demo the dressers at work. Take advantage of lobby wall space to feature displays that tell the story, not just of the production, but of the production process. Our collaborative artistry deserves to be on display beyond the results of the live performance and in multiple creative ways.

As more of our audiences understand the critical roles of the variety of production

personnel necessary to bring a show or project to life, the more likely we will find allies when we need to justify our resource requests. Using the power of knowledge could lead to greater advocacy for appropriate funding and support. While we want to continue to celebrate our ability to surprise and astonish, from time to time, let's spread the word about our many talents as designers and technicians to increase understanding.

Sharing your work with others in the industry is also a great way to help all further develop their skills. Events like *Cover the Walls*, the *Design Expo*, and the *Tech Expo* are all opportunities to spread the word about the work that you do. All of us have an obligation to advocate for the creative artistry that is live performance!


